SECTION | covers the first three months of pregnancy and is useful in discussing with your patients the menstrual cycle, ovulation, fertilization, implantation and the appearance and size of the fetus through the end of the twelfth week. The "Trans-Vision" portion of Section I shows the appearance of the uterus and fetus at the end of the first trimester and the relationships of the uterus to other pelvic 4 to 11 structures . SECTION II is designed so that the "Trans-Vision" illustrations show the increasing silhouettes as pregnancy advances. Emphasis is placed on the growing fetus and the mother's urinary bladder, lower bowel, lower vertebrae and breasts. Also included in this section are pictures showing the stages of labor, bag of waters, the actual de-12 to 21 livery, the placenta and some of the details of involution SECTION III deals with the lactating breast. The large illustration on each acetate sheet shows the gross anatomy at various functional levels. The diagrams are intended to help the physician in instructing patients in efficient and comfortable breast feeding 22 to 25 SECTION IV is concerned with some of the immediate problems of the mother during her first week or two at home with the baby . . . 26 to 27
